Can Forgive - But Can't Forget!

Fr. John E. Taylor (R.I.P)

I know people who claim - as though it were a virtue! - that they can forgive but can't, or WON'T forget! I also know a man who - although he obviously has faults like the rest of us - has one most engaging quality: He does not hold grudges. The latter gentleman, I would say, is more likely to enjoy that "Happy New Year!" we all wish one another today for 2024, while those who cannot forget are clutching a recipe for gloom and doom.

We can't, of course, forget at will an injury from someone else by punching the "DELETE" button as on a computer; besides it is only prudent to guard against being hurt by the same person a second time. We can refrain, however, from endlessly dwelling upon the wrong and planning to get even with the offender.

"Be not swift to take offence - Let it pass! Anger is a foe to sense - Let it pass! Brood not darkly over wrong Which will disappear ere long; Rather sing this cheery song: "Let it pass!"

GOD forgives and forgets. Punishment may come as the unavoidable result from our transgressions, BUT GOD WIPES OUT REPENTED SIN AS THOUGH IT HAD NEVER BEEN COMMITTED! "Wash me through and through from my wickedness," David begs God, in Psalm 51:2, after the heinous sins of adultery and murder, "and cleanse me from my sin." In John Bunyan's "Pilgrim's Progress", Christian staggers repentant to the foot of the Cross; the burden of sin falls from his shoulders and rolls to the bottom of the hill. Likewise with us after God's repeated forgiveness.

Ancestors of those of us of African heritage were cruelly treated in slavery, while our own generation often suffers racial injustice still. We cherish and guard our freedoms, but must not become bitter, dwelling upon the past.

There are grievances and challenges we must encounter and overcome in 2024 - there is no time to dredge up old ones to torment us. A week or two ago we were singing in Advent: ".....Cast away the dreams of darkness, / O ye children of the day!....."

"Echo not an angry word - Let it pass! Think how often YOU have erred - Let it pass! Time at last makes all things straight; Let us not resent, but wait, And our vict'ry shall be great - Let it pass!"
